Over the last ten years, Freres lumber has logged more acres of Mt. Hood National Forest than any other active timber company. Freres Lumber is notorious for their disregard for community and ecosystem health. In 1999, the vice president of Freres Lumber publicly opposed the Salem City Council's resolution against logging in their drinking watershed. Most recently Freres Lumber purchased the highly controversial

Solo and Cub timber sales. Together these sales will log over 300 acres of mature and old growth forest on our public lands.

Rosboro Lumber is one of the top 5 companies logging public lands in Oregon and Washington, and one of the top 5 loggers in Mt. Hood National Forest. They have purchased many controversial sales in the Oak Grove Watershed.



BMC West is one of the largest retail lumberyards in North America. They profit from the destruction of forests from Chile to Alaska.



There are currently nearly 60 timber sales being planned or logged in the Mt. Hood National Forest.
